

# Mountaineers have strong second meet

The men's distance medley relay picked up a victory while Paige Dodd came in second in the women's pentathlon to pace the efforts of the Eastern Oregon track and field team Friday and Saturday at the Ed Jacoby Invite in Nampa, Idaho.

The men's DMR team of Hunter Kratz, Devin Lewis-Allen, Alex Navarro and Lane Inwards beat a trio of College of Idaho teams for the top spot with a time of 10:18.25.

Dodd finished with 3,484 points in the pentathlon, just 93 points behind event winner Annie Wright of George Fox. Dodd's best performance in the pentathlon was in the high jump, where she placed second with a mark of 5-feet-7, just missing the overall school record. She was also third in the 800-meter run, sixth in the 60-meter hurdles, and eighth in both the shot put

and long jump.

Olivia Lane was seventh in the pentathlon with 3,097 points, fifth in the 800, seventh in the high jump, ninth in the 60 hurdles and shot put, and 13th in the long jump.

The EOU men put two in the top four in the pole vault, with Corey Sledge (15-feet-11) taking second and Darrin Walker (14-feet-11) placing fourth. EOU also had three top-five finishers in the men's 600 in second-place Lewis-Allen (1:22.88), third-place Cooper Shaw (1:24.36) and fifth-place Derian Handfield (1:25.99). Meanwhile, Navarro placed third in the 1,000 in 2:30.14, and teammate Travis Running took eighth (2:37.74).

Alex Kosel was fifth in the men's long jump (22-feet-1-1/2) and seventh in the triple jump (44-feet-5-1/2), and Conner Young was seventh in the 400 (50.18 seconds). Two EOU teams placed in

the men's 4-by-400 relay, with Shaw, Corey Wocken-fuss, Young and Lewis-Allen placing third (3:24.08), and Brennen LeBel, Running, Austin Hunter and Kosel finishing eighth (3:24.06).

Sam Roddewig placed fifth in the men's heptathlon with a total of 4,420 points. In the event he won the pole vault at 15-feet-1. He was also fifth in the 60 hurdles, seventh in the shot put, ninth in the 1,000, 11th in the high jump and the 60, and 12th in the long jump. Teammate Jonah Coats placed 10th with 4,046 points, taking fourth in the pole vault, eighth in the high jump, ninth in the long jump, 11th in the shot put and the 1,000 and 12th in the 60 and the 60 hurdles.

Back on the women's side, Ebony Wilson tied for fourth in the women's long jump at 17-feet-11-1/2, with teammate Morgan Red-dington right behind in sixth at 17-feet-9. Kennedy Lake was sixth in the pole vault at 10-feet-4, Kalulusno Ngaida was eighth in the women's high jump at 5-feet-3-1/4, and Elizabeth Herbes and Megan Bolton finished 7-8 in the women's 600 in times of 1:39.07 and 1:39.94, respectively.

Bolton, Megan Boals, Michelle Herbes and Elizabeth Herbes added an eighth-place finish for EOU in the women's 4-by-400 relay (4:03.18).

EOU returns to the track Feb. 1 at the Jacksons Invite in Nampa.

### EOU men battle at Clackamas

Blake McNall (133 pounds) took second place to lead the Eastern Oregon men's wrestling team, which had three top-four finishers, at the Clackamas Open Sunday.

McNall went 2-1 and scored a 21-5 technical fall over unattached wrestler Angelo Reyes to reach the finals, where he lost by a 6-2 decision to San Francisco State's Jordan Gurrola.

Marco Retano (174) went 2-2 to take fourth, including

scoring a close 12-10 sudden victory in the consolation semifinals over Western Washington's Milo Holsten. He lost a 7-4 decision to unattached wrestler Jacob Mendoza in the third-place match.

Also taking fourth and going 3-2 was Harley Dilulo (197). He reached the third-place match with a win by 20-0 technical fall over Simon Fraser's Niela Takafua before dropping the third-place match to Oregon State's Jarrad Dixon by fall.

Dally Ratcliff (149) went 3-2 on the day, and Tyler Miller (141), Jared Brant (149), Noel Orozco (285) and Justin Wilson (285) each finished 2-2.

Eastern returns home Friday to face North Idaho College.

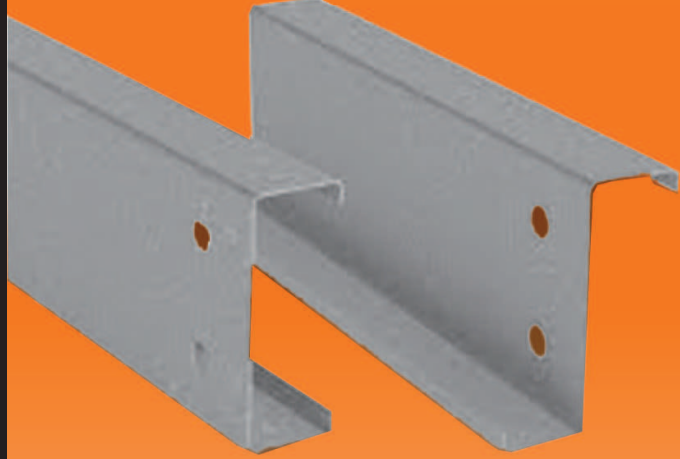
