

Eastern adds another title

Unlike Friday's double overtime thriller, Monday's Cascade Collegiate Conference championship game provided little drama.

A stout defensive effort, a big first half from its star player and a balanced second-half attack boosted the Eastern Oregon women's basketball team to its third straight CCC tournament title, 75-60, over Corban in front of a capacity crowd at Quinn Coliseum.

"I don't feel like teams get lucky enough to be that successful that often. It's been the coolest experience," said senior Maren Herrud, who scored 17 points.

EOU, which trailed for just nine seconds, was already ahead by double figures entering the second after three Emma Logan free throws capped a 7-0 run to end the first quarter.

That's when Maya Ah You-Dias, who scored a game-high 27 points, broke the game open. The senior

scored eight straight Mountaineer points to open the second, then hit a pull-up jumper and a 3-pointer to give EOU its largest lead, 35-12, with 5:19 to play in the first half.

It was the defense, though, that helped set the early tone, forcing Corban to take several tough shots, many with the shot clock winding down. A big piece of the scouting report was focused on Corban's Jordan Woodvine and on help defense.

The Joseph Eagles girls basketball team will find out pretty quickly if it's going to be in the mix to play for a



The teams met earlier this season, with Joseph taking a 24-21 lead into the fourth quarter before St. Paul found a spark for


a 40-32 win.







