February 2019: fourthcoldest, secondwettest on record

PENDLETON — According to preliminary data received by NOAA's National Weather Service in Pendleton. temperatures at La Grande averaged much colder than normal during the month of February. The average temperature was 28.3 degrees, 6.1 degrees below normal. High temperatures averaged 35.5 degrees, 7.4 degrees below normal. The highest was 47 degrees on the 2nd. Low temperatures averaged 21.1 degrees, 4.8 degrees below normal. The lowest was 1 degree on February 7. There were 24

days with the low temperature below 32 degrees, and there were eight days when the high temperature stayed below 32 degrees.

Precipitation totaled 3.44 during February, inches which was 2.30 inches above normal. Measurable precipitation (at least .01 inch) was received on 11 days, with the heaviest, 1.10 inches, reported on February 25. Precipitation this year has reached 5.60 inches, 2.83 inches above normal. Since October, the water year precipitation at La Grande has been 11.21 inches, 3.46 inches above normal.

In February, snowfall totaled 24 inches, with at least 1 inch of snow reported on four days. The heaviest snowfall was 12 inches reported on the 25th. The greatest reported depth of snow on the ground was 14 inches on the 25th.

The outlook for March from NOAA's Climate Prediction Center calls for below normal temperatures and near normal precipitation. Normal highs for La Grande rise from 47 degrees at the start of March to 55 degrees at the end of March. Normal lows rise from 28 degrees to 33 degrees. The 30year normal precipitation is 1.46 inches.

wThis was the fourthcoldest February on record. The coldest was 23.9 degrees in 1989. It was also the second-wettest February on record. The wettest was 3,91 inches in 1986.
