Stan was a skilled hunter, preferring the Wenaha and Chesnimus areas for both deer and elk, also took meticulous care of his vegetable gardens and landscaping around his homes. Having also worked as a chef in his younger days, Stan was known by family members for his skills in the kitchen.

Stan attended the Nazarene churches in Elgin and Pendleton, and he drove the Elgin church's Sunday school bus for many years. He was also a volunteer Emergency Medical Technician with the Elgin Ambulance for several years.


