Both Gus and Zeb Ramsden had two hits, and Zeb Ramsden had two RBIs to lead the Eagles. Gage McKay added an RBI single in the second inning for Wallowa Valley.

Coy Aschenbrenner allowed just one run on one hit in four innings with three walks and a strikeout for the win, and Trace Evans struck out three batters in three innings for the save.

Ramsden drove in a pair of runs in the fourth inning between RBI singles by Kaden McClure and Zeb Ramsden to help break a 1-1 tie.
