

Coats, who had 2,891 points after five events in day one, took ninth in the 110 hurdles (17.45 seconds) and seventh in the discus (87-feet-2), tied for second in the high jump (14-feet-3-1/4), and was third in the javelin (135-feet-5) and ninth in the 1,500 (5:06.40).

Roddewig, who 2,845 points after day one, placed seventh in the 110 hurdles (17.24), sixth in the discus (102-feet-0), third in the javelin (144-feet-2) and sixth in the 1,500 (4:43.80). Roddewig missed on all three attempts in the pole
