

# Power surge lifts LHS

Grande's Jaiden La Hafer has come to expect offensive barrages by the

Tigers softball team. So she wasn't at all surprised about the team's effort in a 12-0, five-inning home win over the Fruitland Grizzlies Wednesday that featured the Tigers collecting 13 hits, and one in which she hit two of the team's four home runs.

"We play great all the

time, so nothing really stood out. I just expect us to hit the ball and put the ball in play so we can score runs," the junior said.

Jacie Howton and Jayce Seavert also went deep for the Tigers. Head coach Woody Wright said the team had to make a couple adjustments to a slower pitcher than they are typically used to seeing. He also said the key was allowing the ball to travel a bit closer to the plate before swinging.

## Tiger boys claim title at Walla Walla

Braden Bell was one of four La Grande golfers to shoot in the 80s, finishing with a score of 80 to lead the Tiger boys to victory Wednesday at Wine Valley Golf Course in Walla Walla, Washington.

"Having four in the 80s is awesome," head coach Ron Evans said. "That puts us (in scoring range) to compete at state."

Joining Bell in the 80s were Cruz Gallegos at 83, Tristen Shepherd at 84 and Bradon McCall at 86. Anton Evans rounded out the scoring at 107, with all the scores coming on what Ron Evans said is a tough course.

"The greens are big and (there's not) a flat spot on them," he said. "They kept the ball in play, hit it down the middle (of the fairway) and on or close to the green. And they putted well.'

The Tigers' winning score of 333 was well ahead of second-place DeSales, Washington (359) and rival Baker (363), which was third.

"They're all starting to come together (and) supporting each other," the head coach said. "They're meshing as a team."
