Ledbetter wins twice to lead Mountaineers' track team

Maggie Ledbetter had a career weekend for the Eastern Oregon women's track and field team, winning both the discus and the shot put — and automatically qualifying for nationals in the discus - to lead the Mountaineers efforts at the Border Clash Friday and Saturday in Boise,

The Cove product had a mark of 145-feet-11 in the discus and a mark of 42-feet-3-1/2 to win both events, and added a thirdplace finish in the hammer throw at 149-feet-2.

Eastern also claimed the top

spot in the women's 4x400 relay with Olivia Lane, Paige Dodd, Michelle Herbes and Elizabeth Herbes running the race in 3:53.65. The time was also an automatic qualifying mark for nationals.

The Mountaineers also had a handful of second-place finishes from Morgan Reddington in the long jump (17-feet-11-1/2), Michelle Herbes in the 800 (2:14.85), Katie Emerson in the 400 hurdles (1:05.05) and the 4x100 relay team of Haley White, Kinnah Rhodes, Payton Jolley and Elizabeth Herbes (48.39).

Jolley and Elizabeth Herbes

both added two third-place finishes, Jolley in the pole vault (9feet-10-1/2) and the long jump (17-feet-11), and Herbes in the 100 (12.84) and the 200 (25.88). Also in third was Stephanie Miears in the shot put (39-feet-3-3/4), Dierdre McKay in the 3,000 steeplechase (12:53.72), Dodd in the 100 hurdles (14.93), White in the 400 hurdles (1:05.90) and Megan Boals, Kaitlyn Burgess, Emily Palmer and Faith Homer in the 4x400 relay (4:08.96).

The EOU men's team took second place in both relays, with Branden Phanmaha, Connor Young, Nicholas Griffin and Austin Hunter finishing the 4x100 relay in 43.22, and Griffin, Robie Swanson, Kobe Crump and Hunter Schiess completing the 4x400 in 3:32.86. Allex Kosel added second-place finishes in both the high jump (6-feet-1-1/4) and the long jump (21-feet-10-3/4).

In third were Dawson Kennon in the javelin (180-feet-4), Darrian Walker in the pole vault (15-feet-1), Young in the 200 (22:14) and Young, Brennen LeBel, Braxton Wilson and Derian Handfield in the 4x400 relay

EOU also had a handful of

athletes compete at the Oregon State High Performance meet in Corvallis. Eastern was led on the men's side by second-place finishes from Devin Lewis-Allen in the 400 (49.49) and Jakob Sandhagen in the javelin (188-feet-7), and a third-place effort by Lane Inwards in the 5,000 (14:56.05).

The top performer on the women's side was Kalulusno Ngaida, who tied for fourth in the high jump (5-feet-2-1/4) and placed fourth in triple jump (37feet-9-1/2).
