

Parker Robinson scored when Danny Chamberlain was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded, Isaac Zamora scored on a bases-loaded walk to Payton Cooper, and Justin Comfort scored when Riley Miller was hit by a pitch, also with the bases loaded, for a 7-3 lead.

Hermiston scored twice in the bottom of the seventh, but fell short.

The Bulldogs scored once in the third inning

and twice in the fourth to take a 3-0 lead, but La Grande evened the score with three runs in the fifth on an RBI groundout by Wyatt Earp and a two-run single by Isaac Zamora.
