If you have received the email, do not open it or hit "reply," and immediately delete it. According to the release, the SBDC is "diligently working" with the EOU technology department to address the issue.

**FCC implements Ray Baum's  
Act to combat robocalls**

WASHINGTON, D.C. — According to a press release from Rep. Greg Walden (R-Hood River), the Federal Communications Commission announced a plan to implement provisions from the Ray Baum's Act to ban malicious spoofing calls and text messages. Walden helped pass into law the Ray Baum's Act last Congress. The legislation was named after Ray Baum, a La Grande native and Walden's former staff director on the Energy and Commerce Committee. Baum lost his life to cancer in February 2018.

The law prohibited spoofing calls or texts originating outside of the United States, provided the FCC with greater authority to protect consumers from robocalls and required the FCC to work with the Federal Trade Commission to educate Americans about available options to stop illegal robocalls.
