third year in a row, scoring late in the first half and then adding a pair of second-half goals to top Corban, 3-0, Wednesday in the tournament semifinals in Springfield.

The win sends EOU into the championship match today against Rocky Mountain. With top seed and regular-season champion Oregon Tech eliminated from the tournament, the winner between No. 2 EOU and

No. 3 RMC will collect the conference's second automatic bid to nationals.

Eastern punished the Corban defense to the tune of a 9-2 shot advantage in the first half but didn't find the scoreboard until Camie Edgington scored in the 41st minute to put the Mountaineers ahead 1-0 at the half. Eastern put six shots on goal in the period, but five were stopped by Corban keeper Elizabeth Brock.

Lindsay Balkenbush gave Eastern some breathing room early in the second half

with a goal in the 58th minute, and Morgan Farrington capped off the night in the 78th minute with her 10th goal of the season.

Savannah Hutchinson, in net for the second straight day for an injured Cydni Cottrell, recorded three saves to preserve EOU's second shutout of the tournament and fifth in a row.

The Mountaineers (14-2-2 overall) and Rocky Mountain (13-3-2) meet at 2 p.m. today in Springfield. EOU won the first matchup on the road, 2-1, in double overtime.

BADGERS HIT THE ROAD AGAIN FOR QUARTERFINAL MATCHUP

Powder Valley's defense will be put to the test on Saturday.

The Badgers, who are in the 1A state quarterfinals for the first time since 2016, will hit the road for the second time in as many weeks as they travel to face undefeated Camas Valley.

Both teams enter the contest after taking part in their highest scoring games of the season. The Badgers (7-3 overall) had to score a late touchdown to outlast Lowell in the first round, 68-62. Camas Valley, meanwhile, held on for an 86-50 win over Mapleton that saw it rack up its highest point total since the Hornets' 2012 state title team scored 94 points in a first-round playoff win over Cove.

Camas Valley (8-0 overall) has been a juggernaut on offense. The Hornets enter averaging 64 points per game and have not been held to less than 50 points in a contest this season. The defense, which allowed a season high in points against Mapleton, has been stout for the most part, averaging 15 points per game.

The Badgers have also been strong offensively, and they enter the quarterfinals with the offense clicking at its best level of the season. Powder Valley has had its three highest scoring games — 54, 60 and now 68 — in the last four weeks, and is putting up 45.6 points per game on average.

The defense, though, is allowing 39 points per game, meaning the Badgers will either need to come up with some timely stops or prepare for a shootout.

Powder Valley did both last week, forcing a fumble late in the fourth quarter of its win over Lowell before scoring the winning touchdown.

Kickoff for the contest is at noon Saturday. Camas Valley is aiming for its first semifinal berth since 2014, while the Badgers are looking to get back to the semis for the first time since 2003.

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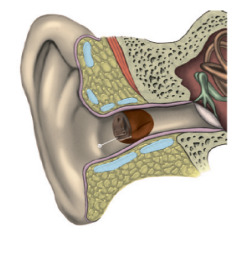
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
