Ninman posted a 2-1 record on the mat for EOU at 157 pounds, including a 19-4 technical fall victory over Southwestern Oregon Community College's Kendrick Borchard and an 8-4 decision over Caiden Cohen of Clackamas Community College to reach the semifinals. His only loss came in the semis to North Idaho's Jacob Swift, a 15-0 technical fall. He added a win by forfeit and by no contest to finish third.
