JOSEPH — A parade, a lighting contest, numerous open houses and an ongoing bazaar will usher in the holiday season during the annual Jingle Thru Joseph festival.

A holiday bazaar will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Nov. 29-30 and Dec. 6-7 at The Place, 303 S. Lake St. This is a new location, said Sally Brandt, who owns The Sheep Shed. Hurricane Creek Grange will have food available.

The ongoing bazaar will feature a variety of gifts, decorations, jewelry, photography, woodwork, knitted and woven items, quilting, pottery, felted ornaments, Sally B. Farms Soap, Rada Knives Artwork and more.

“There will be food and lots of different handcrafted lovely things,” Brandt said. “It’s going to be a great selection.”

The merchant lighting contest will be judged this Friday at 5 p.m. On Saturday, Santa will visit The Outlaw from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.
