initiative petition which reads as
follows:
**CAPTION: REPEAL CITY OF
LA GRANDE ORDINANCE
BANNING MARIJUANA RELAT-
ED BUSINESSES.**
QUESTION: Shall the City of
La Grande repeal Ordinance
Number's 3227 and 3228, Se-
ries 2015 prohibiting marijuana
businesses in the City?
SUMMARY: In September 2015,
Ordinance 3227, Series 2015
was adopted by City Council,
prohibiting sales of limited mar-
ijuana retail products from med-
ical marijuana dispensaries as
provided in Oregon Senate Bill
460. In October 2015, Ordinance
3228, Series 2015, was adopted
by the City Council, banning
medical marijuana processing
sites, medical marijuana dispen-
saries, recreational marijuana
producers, recreational mari-
juana processors, recreational
marijuana wholesalers and re-
creational marijuana retailers.
The proposed repeal would lift
the ban on medical marijuana
sites, medical marijuana dispen-
saries, recreational marijuana
producers, recreational mari-
juana processors, recreation-
al marijuana wholesalers and
recreational marijuana retailers
to operate in La Grande.
This ballot title was provided by
the City Attorney, Wyatt Baum.
Any registered voter who is a
resident of the City of La Grande
and who is dissatisfied with the
ballot title may file a petition with
the Circuit Court for review of
the ballot title, naming the City
Attorney as the respondent.
The deadline to file this petition
is 5:00 p.m., March 12, 2020.
Anyone filing a petition with the
Circuit Court for review of the
Ballot Title must notify the City
Elections Official in writing by
5:00 p.m. on the first business
day after the petition is filed with
the Circuit Court.
The prospective initiative peti-
tion complies with procedural
constitutional requirements for
local initiative petitions. Any
registered voter who is a res-
ident of the City of La Grande
may challenge the determina-
tion of the constitutional require-
ment determination in Circuit
Court. The deadline for this fil-
ing is 5:00 p.m., March 12, 2020.
Anyone filing a petition with the
Circuit Court to challenge the
procedural constitutional review
must notify the City Elections
Official in writing by 5:00 p.m. on
the first business day after the
petition is filed with the Circuit
