In an effort to slow the spread of the coronavirus, Oregon Governor Kate Brown closed schools through at least April 28. Baker School District immediately responded to devise ways to keep feeding children, provide child care for health workers, and provide resources for parents. Inside this issue you will find stories detailing plans and programs in place and in the works across the district.

District providing breakfast, lunch

When Oregon Governor Kate Brown canceled school across the state in response to the coronavirus pandemic, Baker School District's nutrition department quickly put together a system to provide breakfast and lunch to youth ages 18 and younger. Children need not be enrolled in the school district to receive a meal.

Service groups, churches, and individuals volunteered to help pass out food at district schools.

"We had a lot of people reaching out to help — we couldn't have done it without them," said Jessica Dalton, district nutrition director.

The cancellation is extended to April 28, and the district will continue to provide meals.

The number of meals provided is "growing daily," Dalton said.

Meals are prepared at Baker High School, which is the main site for distribution. Cars can use the bus lane.



Volunteers are helping hand out lunch and breakfast for children age 18 and younger. Parents can pick up meals at the site that is most convenient, although Baker High is the main location.

Meals are provided free of charge for ages 18 and younger (even those too young to be in school). Those picking up 6 or more meals are asked to go to Baker High School.
