his friends or partners has done the actual work of filling them. It's been a trial run to see what processes might work most efficiently.

The manufacturing process will be moved to Wallowa County as soon as a proper local location is found," Harvey said. "We want to, and expect to, provide year-around family wage jobs. The mayor of Joseph, Teresa Sajonia, is actively working to help locate a site."

Harvey and his partners want to eventually support local science, technology and math education in Wal-

lowa County schools. Wallowa Valley Cleaning Products plans to begin selling products locally in June and across the Northwest soon afterwards.
