She didn’t finish her schooling past the eighth grade because she needed to work to help the family.

On March 5, 1941, Betty married Bob Gulzow in Weiser, Idaho. They were married 60 years before his death in 2002. Betty and Bob were long-time farmers in the Grande Ronde Valley. They enjoyed traveling in various countries and going south for many years. They spent several years living on the Coast and then Salem, where Bob passed away.
