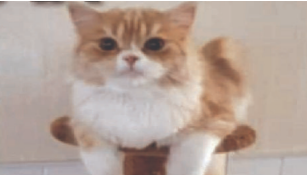

OREGON TELEPHONE CORP PUBLIC NOTICE

Lifeline service is a government program designed to make monthly residential telecommunication services more affordable to eligible low-income customers. Customers who are eligible for the Lifeline program are also eligible for toll blocking at no additional charge.

The Federal Lifeline discount can be applied to qualifying voice or broadband services. In order to be eligible for the Federal Lifeline discount, a customer's annual household income must be at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or a customer must participate in one of the following programs: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); Medicaid; Supplemental Security Income (SSI); Federal Public Housing Assistance; Veterans Pension & Survivors Pension; or qualifying Tribal Programs.

Lifeline is a non-transferable service and eligible subscribers may receive assistance from only one wireline or wireless telecommunications provider per household. Only eligible customers may enroll in the program. Customers are required to submit a Lifeline application form and will be required to certify continued eligibility annually. Customers who willfully make false statements in order to obtain Lifeline benefits can be punished by fine or imprisonment or can be barred from the program.

Basic services are offered to all customers in Oregon Telephone Corp. service territories at the rates, terms, and conditions specified in Oregon Telephone Corp's tariff. Notice is hereby given that a ballot title for a measure referred by the City of Union City Council has been filed with the Elections Officer of the City of Union, Oregon on July 29, 2020.

The November 3, 2020 election will be conducted by mail pursuant to ORS 254.465.

An elector may file a petition for review of this ballot title in Union County Circuit Court no later than 5:00 p.m. August 7, 2020 pursuant to ORS 250.296.

Caption: ADOPTS REVISIONS TO THE CHARTER FOR UNION CITY GOVERNMENT

Question: Shall the city of Union revise the current City charter?

Summary: If adopted, this measure would revise and update the language in the current City charter.

- Changes include the use of gender-neutral terms to describe the mayor and city councilors, as well as prohibit city employees from serving as mayor or councilors.
- Minor revisions would be made to the sections relating to elections, and vacancies and removal from office, of councilors.
- Antiquated and unenforceable provisions relating to the City's ability to take on indebtedness and damages for claims against the City would be removed or revised.
- In addition there are several needed changes to the sections addressing the wastewater and water systems, including updates on the financing for improvements to the same.
