The Big Read kicks off this week

2021 features 'In the Heart of the Sea'

ENTERPRISE — Fishtrap kicked off the 2021 NEA Big Read this week featuring "In the Heart of the Sea" by Nathaniel Philbrick, a nonficition account about the sinking of the American wahling ship Essex in 1820 — an event that inspired Herman Melville's 1851 novel "Moby-Dick."

Several months of Big Read events began with a talk on whaling by Dr. Lisa T. Ballance, director of Oregon State University's Marine Mammal Institute and Endowed Chair of Marine Mammal Research.

Her topic covers industrial whaling between the late 1800s and mid-1900s — the same era of The Essex is "In the Heart of the Sea."

Ballantine's talk includes inforamtion about large-scale illegal whaling "that occurs in contravention of national laws or international agreements, of 'scientific whaling' that is allowed through a provision in the International Convention for the Regulation of Whaling, and of aboriginal whaling that is practiced by many indigenous peoples all over the globe, including here in the Pacific Northwest."

The 2015 film "In the Heart of the Sea" will be streamed Feb. 18 on fishtrap.org.

The historical adventure-drama film was directed and produced by Ron Howard and written by Charles Leavitt. It is based on NaPhilbrick's 2000 non-fiction book of the same name.

An international co-production between the United States and Spain, the film stars Chris Hemsworth, Benjamin Walker, Cil-



lian Murphy, Tom Holland, Ben Whishaw, and Brendan Gleeson.
