

There's a familiarity to working with Michael that is just inherent, which is very comforting when you walk onto the set for the first time and the cast and crew all know each other. As our story unfolds, I'm going to be introduced to this wonderful cast more than being in this kind of gray and very, very intense situation with Martin Whitly.

Diversity is a big consideration in making a television series now. How have you found that on "Prodigal Son"?

Kudos to Fox, because they do something that is very, very important to us as actors. This show has a fantastic diversity behind the camera. Our crew represents all of us ... women, race, everything, and that's really nice. People are working full-focus on, first of all, doing good work – but being gracious and respectful to everybody else who is making the show work.
