Sumpter Valley RR runs diesel train this weekend

MCEWEN—Sumpter Valley Railroad will be running their diesel engine this weekend, including a special Friday night ride.

A train departs McEwen Station at 8:30 p.m. Friday, June 25, and travels to Sumpter for an evening of star gazing. Fares are \$18 adults, \$15 seniors/military, \$10 youth.

Train rides on Saturday and Sunday, June 26 and 27, will leave from the Sumpter Station for four short runs to the river and back. Times are 11 a.m., 12:30 p.m., 2 p.m., and 3:30 p.m. Fares are \$15 adults, \$13 seniors/military, \$8 youth.
