area, enjoyed fishing and bird hunting with extended family. His interests were art and music. He learned to play the trumpet, cutting a record in


the process. Robert enlisted in the U.S. Army. While serving he was sent to the Philippines to destroy parts and equipment after the war so they didn't fall into enemy hands.
