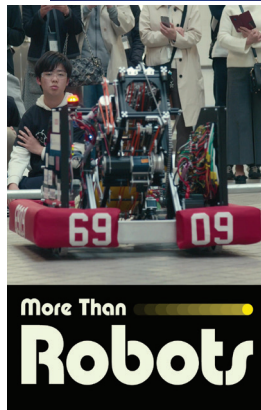
“Cheaper by the Dozen” (March 18)

Explored in 1950 and 2003 (and several sequels), this newest iteration based on the novel by Frank Bunker Gilbreth Jr. and Ernestine Gilbreth Carey stars Gabrielle Union (“L.A.’s Finest”) and Zach Braff (“Scrubs”) as the heads of a blended family of 12, who must navigate a chaotic home life while managing a family business.



“More Than Robots” (March 18)

Best known as an actress in sitcoms such as “Community” and “Love,” Gillian Jacobs stepped behind the camera to direct this feature-length documentary that follows four teams of teenagers from around the world as they prepare for the 2020 First Robotics Competition amid a global pandemic and with limited resources.
