Murante's award-winning original songs feature stories about everyday folks, combining lyrics with an upbeat, joyful folk-rock style. In the past 10 years, he has won more than 18 awards in US and international competitions for songwriting and performance, including Grand Prize Winner of

Awbrey is a songwriter based out of Portland and the rural Oregon Coast Range. A first-generation musician, she has been performing since 2012 and releasing music since 2014.
