FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION

LET IT BE KNOWN TO ALL PERSONS of the City of Sumpter, Baker County, Oregon that discrimination in the sale, rental, lease, advertising of sale, rental or lease, financing of housing or land to be used for

construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage or rental services because of race, color, religion, sex, disability (physical or mental), familial status (children) or national origin is prohibited by Title VIII of the federal Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988. It is the policy of the City of Sumpter, Baker County Oregon to support the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and to implement a Fair Housing Program to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, disability (physical and mental), familial status (1. children, and 2. actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity or marital status or its members), or national origin. Therefore, the City of Sumpter, Baker County Oregon does hereby pass the following Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that within the resources available to the City/County through city, county, state, federal and community volunteer sources, the City of Sumpter, Baker County, Oregon will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, disability (physical and mental), familial status(children) or national origin in the process of filing a complaint with the Oregon Civil Rights Division or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Seattle Regional Office Compliance Division, that they may seek equity under federal and state laws.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Sumpter shall publicize this Resolution and through this publicity shall cause real estate brokers and sellers, private home sellers, rental owners, rental property managers, real estate and rental advertisers, lenders, builders, developers, home buyers and home or apartment renters to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances.

THE FAIR HOUSING PROGRAM, for the purpose of informing those affected of their respective responsibilities and rights concerning Fair Housing law and complaint procedures, will at a minimum include, but not be limited to: 1) the printing, publicizing and distribution of this Resolution; 2) the distribution of posters flyers, pamphlets and other applicable Fair Housing information provided by local, state andfedera sources, through local media of community contacts; and 3) the publicizing of locations where assistance will be provided to those seeking to file a discrimination complaint.

EFFECTIVE DATE This Resolution shall take effect upon signing.

If a First Tier Sub-Contractor Disclosure form is not received by 3:00 p.m. the bid will be considered Non-Responsive. Installation of about 3,200 lineal feet of waterline main, including service pipe, blow off assemblies, fire hydrants, and asphalt resurfacing. Each bid must contain a statement as to whether the Bidder is a resident Bidder, as defined in ORS 279.120. In determining the lowest responsible Bidder, City of Haines will, for the purpose of awarding the Contract, add a percentage increase on the bid of a nonresident Bidder equal to the percentage, if any, of the preference given to that Bidder in the state in which the Bidder resides.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a bid bond payable to City of Haines in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the amount bid.

The successful Bidder will be required to furnish separate Performance and Payment Bonds of one hundred percent (100%) submitted on the prescribed forms for faithful performance of the Contract in the full amount of the Contract price. The Surety issuing the bond must have an attorney-in-fact or a principal doing business in the State of Oregon. This information must be included on the bond statement.

The Contracting Agency will not receive or consider an Offer for a Public Improvement Contract unless the Offeror is registered with the Construction Contractors Board, or is licensed by the State Landscape Contractors Board, as specified in OAR 137-049-0230.
