this, processors can obtain milk locally to meet their production needs. Some plant managers say they are running reduced production schedules due to labor shortages Contacts report these reduced schedules are contributing to increased milk availability. Across all Classes, demand is unchanged.

Milk production is declining in the mountain states of Idaho, Utah, and Colorado, Contacts say seasonally high temperatures are reducing cow comfort and having a negative impact on milk output. Milk volumes are available for processing. Milk is being sold at a discount in the area; some plant managers say this is due to labor shortages and limited tanker availability. Increased educational purchasing is contributing to higher Class I demand, Meanwhile, demands for Classes II and III are unchanged. Demand for condensed skim is strong. Contacts say contract purchasers are pulling near the

higher ends of their availability. Ice cream makers are purchasing condensed skim and cream to running busy production schedules. Cream inventories are tightening amid strong demand and declining cream production.
