Decoration Day-No Session.

The Law Defied in Several States by Striking Miners.

ANARCHY RAMPANT.

In Indiana, Illinois, Ohio and Colorado the authorities have been defied and property destroyed by striking miners. region struck for higher wages and prevented non-union men from taking their places. They then began destroying the mills and mines of the employers who refused their domands.

Governor Waite was appealed to, but he refused to call out the militia to quell, send the state troops to Cripple Creek and arrest the deputies who were guarding the mines, and he did issue a proclaimmediately prepared for war upon the deputies. Getting no protection from the state, the mine owners appealed to several hundred men and sent them to Martin Fritz shot and killed Charles the mines and they were sworn in as

In the meanwhile the strikers had equipped for war, and they took possessition is practically impregnable. Dynamite has been placed in all the mines and the threat is made that at the first move the properties will all be blown up. The strikers are being drilled in war tactics by a West Point graduate. A bloody hattle will result if the dep-

uties attempt to get to the mines.

In the other states the troops were sent to the scenes of trouble as soon as the local authorities were unable to preserve peace and the strikers are held in check by the milituamen. Fully 90 per cent of the strikers in all the riots are foreigners who were imported by the inine owners.




