The death of John Daubenbiss, which occurred at Soquel, Santa Cruz county, marks a page in the history of California that tells of the days of a pioneer of pioneers. He came to America from his birthplace, Bavaria, in 1835, and in 1841 crossed the plains to Oregon and to California in 1843. His first home was at San Jose in 1843, whence he removed to Soquel in 1845. Two years later he bought a farm on which he had since resided. Daubenbiss was in the Mexican war under General Fremont, and at the raising of the American flag at Monterey in 1846 he carried the message from Commodore Sloat to General Sutter at Sutter's fort, Sacramento county, announcing that fact. Deceased built the first grist mill in California, at Niles station, in 1845, for General Vallejo, and the first sawmill in the territory at Soquel in 1847.
