By instruction of the United States attorney general Assistant United States District Attorney Samuel Knight has filed eight suits in the United States circuit court at San Francisco against the Southern Pacific Railroad company, the Central Pacific Railroad company and the trustees under the various mortgages of the Central Pacific Railroad company. The suits are to recover valuable mineral and school lands which were patented by the railroad companies under various acts of congress passed in the 60s. Over \$1,000,000 is involved in the suit. The bill also asks that all parties who have claims under these titles be enjoined from asserting any right, title or interest in them, and ask for the value of the land from the railroad companies in case the court does not annul the patent. The lands involved are along the California and Oregon railway and the Central Pacific line in California.
