DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

Last Saturday was Democratic convention day at Jacksonville. The convention was called to order by Horace Mann, chairman county central committee. M. P. Eggleston was elected chairman of the convention and W. J. Mahoney secretary and L. Mullit, assistant.

The following committees were appointed:

Order of business—J. R. Neil, E. B. Pickel, James Riley.

Credentials—L. L. Mullit, Geo. R. Hammersley, J. A. Whitman.

Resolutions—J. R. Wilson, W. M. Holmes, H. H. Taylor.

The temporary organization was made permanent and the following delegates to the state and congressional convention were elected, all from the towns of the valley, the country precincts having been ignored: E. A. Sherwin, B. D. Provost, Al. Pankey, H. Mann, W. E. Phipps, W. S. Crowell, J. J. Houck, J. E. Coffey, M. M. Taylor, Chas. Nickel and J. D. Olwell.

Following this came the nomination of a county ticket and these gentlemen were named:

State Senator—R. P. Neil, of Ashland. Representatives—Miles Cantrall, of Applegate, John D. Olwell, of Central Point.

Sheriff—Jos. Rader, of Eagle Point. Clerk—John S. Orth, of Jacksonville. Recorder—Oris Crawford, of Gold Hill. Assessor—Wilbur Jones, of Pooch Bah. Commissioner—H. H. Taylor, of Medford.

Treasurer—D. H. Miller, of Medford. Coroner—E. B. Pickel, of Medford. Surveyor—L. S. Treffern, of Ashland. The resolutions reported and adopted were as follows:
