

## OUR CRATER LAKE NATIONAL PARK.

A Few Facts Concerning Crater Lake; Its Geological Formation and Origin. The Best Route to Follow, and Place to Outfit

From the Portland Telegram:

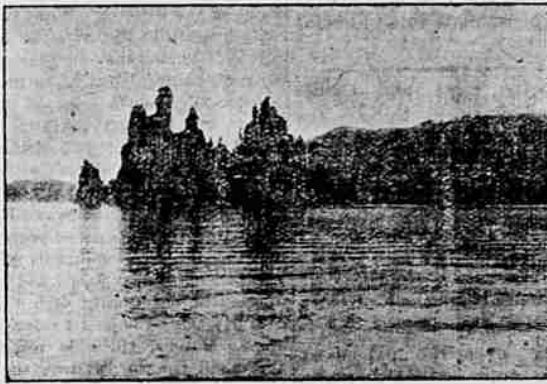
"After 17 years of persistent effort on the part of W. G. Steel and others, a National park has been created at Crater Lake. The park contains 240 square miles, and is about 12 miles wide and 18 miles long. The tract of land embraced in the park was withdrawn from settlement in 1887, so that no settlements have been made, no private rights secured which could interfere with the setting apart of this land for public reserve purposes.

"In many respects the Crater Lake region presents geologic and scenic conditions that make it a place of National interest. The lake was formed by the sinking of a mountain larger than Mount Hood, and no trace has ever been found of any place where the material thus swallowed up was again thrown to the surface. In this particular the disappearance of what is now called Mount Mazama is

Work on the project was begun by Mr. Steel in 1885, and it has had the support of our delegations in congress at each session of that body. Mr. Tongue has been particularly active in this matter, and it is due, in great measure, to his unremitting efforts that the bill creating the Crater Lake National Park has become a law.

In recognition of the timely aid President Roosevelt gave the bill he has been invited to join the party that will visit the lake this summer. An acceptance of this invitation would be an honor to Oregon that would be deeply appreciated, and we can assure the President that he would be amply repaid for the trip.

There are four principal routes by which the lake may be reached: From Medford by way of Rogue river, 83 miles; from Ashland by way of Dead Indian Trail, 90 miles; from Ashland by way of Klamath Falls, 125 miles; from Ager, Calif., by way of Klamath Falls, 116 miles. The trip may be made practically all the way by bicycle, and teams can be driven to the rim of the lake. Medford is the nearest and

without a parallel in geological history. The Cascade Mountains, in the Crater Lake region, are most picturesque and inviting to the tourist seeking the wild and rugged in nature. Its seclusion will save it from the changes which detract from its natural interest.

"The surface of Crater Lake is 6220 feet above the sea level, and the greatest depth of the water is about 2000 feet. There is no known inlet or outlet, but the water is as clear as crystal, as pure as that which bubbles from any spring, and as cold as one would wish to drink. The lake is nearly six miles in diameter. At about 8000 feet above sea level, the crater is six miles in diameter, showing that this was the diameter of the mountain that occupied the place in preglacial ages. At 8000 above sea level, Mount Hood is but two miles in diameter. Geologists have computed that Mount Mazama must have been 15,000 feet high while Mount Hood reaches 11,000 feet. The mass of earth which disappeared with the wrecking of this snow-capped peak contained not less than 17 cubic miles of rock and lava. That this quantity of matter could not have been blown off by a volcanic explosion is proven by a thorough search for rocks that answer the description of the material of which the crater rim is composed.

"Crater Lake was first seen by white men when it was visited in the early '50s by J. W. Hillman and others, who were prospecting for gold. It was then called by them Deep Blue Lake, but was never known by that name by others. In 1896 the Mazamas made a trip to the lake and gave the name Mount Mazama to the mountain which had formerly been there."

nately writes letters to agricultural papers about matters concerning which he is not well informed. Not long ago we had occasion to refer to some rather astonishing information given him to an eastern agricultural paper. More recently a letter over his signature has appeared in the Pacific Homestead and in some eastern agricultural papers in which he says that "a new and effectual way to destroy the codlin moth has been used by a number of Oregon and Washington orchardists. A number of large tin kerosene lamps are placed in the orchards. The lamps are without chimneys," etc. He also describes the banding process and naively remarks that "these methods were first used last year." There is, of course, nothing new about these methods of attempting to fight the codlin moth. The light method has been tried over and over again and the well-established result of its use is to kill very few codlin moths and a great many useful moths. The banding method is useful, but unfortunately does not do away with the necessity of spraying. Mr. Stovall must have been digesting some of the Haelstine moth catcher literature.
