NEITHER WILL CONCEDE DEFEAT.

Special to THE MAIL. PORTLAND, Oregon, June 5, 2:45 p. m.—Neither Chamberlain nor Furnish will concede their defeat. Republicans claim Chamberlain has not over seventy plurality in state, with remote precincts favoring Furnish. Democrats adhere to their claim of four hundred for Chamberlain. Much interest here and wires busy throughout state. Chamberlain claims over seven hundred in Multnomah, while Republicans will not admit over 550 at this hour.

A telephone message from Portland, date June 5, at 2:15, says: Chamberlain 213 ahead, with Curry County still to hear from. Incomplete returns from Lake, Polk and Lincoln.

Election Returns.

In Jackson County the Democrats have elected the majority of their ticket.

The Democrats elected Joe Rader sheriff by about 300; Miles Cantrall and John Odwell to the legislature; John Orth, clerk; Wilbur Jones, assessor; D. H. Miller, treasurer and E. B. Pickett, coroner.

The Republicans elected E. V. Carter State senator, by about 75; Peter Applegate recorder, by 180; Joshua Patter to be commissioner; Jim Hansbrough Republican, has beaten H. Mann for joint representative. Douglas County gave Hansbrough about 400 majority and Jackson County about 350.

Tongue, Republican, has been elected congressman by several hundred majority.

The entire Republican state ticket is elected except governor, which is still in doubt and is claimed by both parties.

No official report can be given on the county ticket as the returns have not as yet been canvassed.
