A LITTLE OF EVERYTHING

Hundreds of people in the suburbs of Boston are being poisoned by a queer kind of caterpillar which infects the shade and fruit trees. When the caterpillar drops on a person it leaves a fuz, which enters the pores of the skin and makes a painful and irritating rash.

The fastest electric road in the world will shortly be put in operation between Chicago and Aurora and Elgin. Special motors have been built to run at 70 miles an hour without heating. The track has been constructed for this speed. The General Electric Co. will soon experiment on this line and try to produce an electric motor that will make 100 miles an hour.

The person who invents a substitute for cork will make a fortune. Cork, which is the bark of a tree that grows principally in Spain and Portugal, is becoming exceedingly scarce and high priced. In the absence of any proper substitute, a new industry—the gathering, cleaning and revamping of old corks—has grown up in our midst. Champagne corks are the finest and most valuable, and rarely are they thrown away.

The movable fort is the invention of F. R. Sims, an Englishman, and one has just been completed. It is designed for coast or road defense and is also adapted to riot work. In coast defense it can be rushed to a danger point, which may be otherwise unprotected. The splendid highways of England permit of the rapid movement of even so large and heavy a machine. Power is furnished by a hydro-carbon engine capable of 1000 revolutions per minute. The motor car can also be used to haul supplies and guns. The car carries two pieces, one at each end, which can be swung around to any range desired.

EARTHQUAKE IN MONTANA.

HELENA, Mont., Aug. 4.—An earthquake in Missoula County last evening caused slight damage. It lasted about two seconds, vibrations being quick and short. At Bonner one of the largest dynamos at the electric plant was shaken from its adjustment. At Clinton the shock was quite severe, the operator reporting that several old buildings collapsed.

Penalties for Setting Fires.

Governor Geer has issued his annual proclamation warning the people against setting fires that may spread to timber, fences or crops. The law on the subject provides a fine of \$20 to \$1000, or imprisonment from three to twelve months, for malicious setting of a fire which shall destroy the buildings, crops, fences or timber of another. If the fire be set without malice, and yet destroy such property, the person setting the fire is liable to a fine of \$10 to \$100. Any person setting fire to any wooded country or forest owned by the United States is liable to a fine of \$1000, or imprisonment for one year, or both fine and imprisonment. In all cases one-half of the fine is to be paid to the person who first furnishes the information to the district attorney.

Railroad Hands Want More Pay.

Section hands on the line of the Southern Pacific in Oregon have asked the company for an advance in wages from the present \$1.40 a day to \$1.75. They reason that they should be paid as much as the men engaged on construction work, as they are often obliged to be out Sundays and to work considerable over time. In case of accidents or washouts, they say they have to be on hand, and so they do not consider the present pay enough with the advanced cost of living.

The company is considering the applications. Section hands work ten hour a day and board themselves out of the pay received. Many of them belong to the Railroad Employees' Union, whose officers are doing what they can to bring the question before the authorities.

The bridge carpenters, too, are asking for certain concessions from the company. At present they work nine hours for a day and are paid \$2.75. The rules require them to be at work when the whistle blows, and they are also to quit promptly on the whistle. The men say they are often obliged to ride for half an hour or more in going to and from work, and they want the time credited to the regular day. They are not asking for an advance in wages.

Farm and Fruit Notes.

From the Rural Northwest.
A buyer from North Dakota who is working in Wheeler County, Oregon, is paying \$19 for yearling steers and \$27 for 2-year-olds.

Four cars of lambs (yearlings) from Idaho, averaging 64 pounds, sold in South Omaha, July 26, at \$8.15 per cwt. 89 Idaho wethers averaging 97 pounds sold on the same day at \$4.40 per cwt.

The Packer says a large eastern operator in apples who has the situation of the growing crop in hand, and has just made a tour of the United States, estimates that the United States will have fully two-thirds of a crop of apples, and that Canada and Nova Scotia will have a full crop.

On July 23, hogs weighing from 200 to 230 pounds sold in Omaha at from \$7.15 to \$7.30 per cwt., and heavier hogs at \$7.35 to \$7.65 per cwt.; in Portland and Seattle at from \$6.25 to \$6.50 per cwt. At San Francisco grain-fed hogs were selling on that day at \$6.25 to \$6.75 per cwt.

There is some complaint of potato blight in Oregon this year. It is well known that the spread of the blight can be checked by spraying Bordeaux mixture. The first indication of blight is observed. The formula: four pounds of blue vitriol and four pounds of fresh slaked lime to 40 gallons of water is good for this purpose.

A few years ago prune growers in the United States had occasion to complain of the competition of cheap Turkish prunes in our home markets. The shoe is now on the other foot. The prune dealers in Servia and Bosnia prunes are complaining that the shipments of low-priced California prunes to Europe have compelled them to lower their prices in order to sell, although they were doing a good business until a few weeks ago, when California's low prices captured European markets.
