## A LITTLE OF EVERYTHING.

The Middle states manufacturers who have enjoyed cheap gas fuel for many years are face to face with exhaustion of the gas supply. Manufactories are beginning to move. It is cheaper to go to coal than to carry coal to them.

An interesting case comes from a New Jersey Federal court. Goods imported from Germany were left in the custom house, the importer refusing to pay the duty. They were sold for \$2190 less than the duty, and now a judge decides that the importer is responsible to the government for the deficit.

A dispatch from benighted Russia says that the commander of a Cossack station is so anxious to have his district show a preponderance of male children that he has decreed that the father of every new girl baby shall receive fifty strokes with a knout. This, however, shows great progress, as not long ago it would have been the mother who would have received the punishment.

The best paid mail-carrier in the world is Oscar Fish, who receives \$35,000 a year for making two trips a month between Valdez and Eagle, Alaska, a distance of a little over four hundred miles. This service is performed with a fine team of Eskimo dogs, and although Mr. Fish has gone over precipices, encountered avalanches, been frost-bitten, frozen and starved, he has always managed to reach his destination.

Southern Illinois has more than 2,000,000 apple trees in an area of over 40,000 acres, which are not in full bearing. The crop is estimated as more than 1,000,000 barrels for this year, which means that if they were all of first grade it would take 6600 cars, or 220 train loads, to move it. A large percentage of the fruit, however, will be evaporated, made into applebutter and otherwise preserved, and only the finest apples will be sold in the natural state.

Official statistics show a decline this year in the number of persons hurt by railroad accidents, as compared with the corresponding months of last year, but the number is altogether too large. In three months 140 persons were killed by accidents and 1810 were injured. In the same time 616 persons were killed and 9520 injured by railroad accidents of all kinds. Many of the "accidents" were not the fault of the railroads but of persons who inexcusably walked on the tracks and did other thing of that nature.

It is said that Mrs. Katherine Tingley, head of the Point Loma Theosophical colony at San Diego, Calif., came into unpleasant prominence through the government's investigation of the importation of Cuban children for the institution. In this investigation it developed that Mrs. Tingley believed that a spaniel dog she has contains the soul of her predecessor, William Q. Judge. It was also alleged that she had fooled rich bankers and other rich men; that she was in the habit of taking parties of young girls to New York and introducing them to gay company, and that she did not believe the marriage ceremony a necessity. Her importation of children will not be permitted.

He leaves a daughter and two sons to mourn his loss, two of whom are living in Langell Valley, Mrs. Mary McDonald and Jeff Wilson. The third one, Simpson Wilson, is living in Rogue River Valley. The remains were brought from Salem and interred in the Bonanza cemetery.

A contribution: District Attorney Reames and Caesar Patrick Dorian went goose hunting the early part of the week, and bagged thirteen geese, an unlucky number. The game was brought to the Linkville Hotel and placed in a side room late in the evening, but upon the following day when an inventory was again taken, all but six of the birds had flown. From May 1st to October 31st—leave Ashland at 5 a. m.; arrive in Klamath Falls by 8 p. m.; leave Klamath Falls at 9 p. m.; arrive in Ashland by 11 a. m.

## Cattle in Lake County.

All this stock will be taken to Merrill to be fed on alfalfa for the winter California market.

## Former State Officer in Trouble.

G. M. Irwin, formerly Superintendent of Public Instruction of Oregon, and also at one time Superintendent of the Salem Indian Training School at Chemawa, is in trouble in Alaska. For a couple of years he has been a United States Commissioner at Juneau. Word comes from there that he is on trial charged with malfeasance in office. The case is causing a great sensation in the Lynn Canal district and will cause much speculation there and throughout Washington and Oregon, where he was once an important figure.

The charges against Irwin were made by two attorneys of Douglas City, which is located opposite Juneau. They allege that he illegally appropriated to his own use a large amount, made up of sums ranging from \$1 to \$10, on criminal cases which came before him for trial. In order to do this successfully, the complaint states, the accused falsified certain records and mutilated others. Up to the present time the accused has borne an excellent reputation.
