meters be made. The present charge for installing and rental on meters seems to me too high. considered the rate on water too low.

In consideration I wish to say to the citizens of Medford that notwithstand ing all the adverse criticisms, the light 20,688.61 140,681.10 409.02 them much less than if a private company had been furnishing them, and I sincerely hope that the next council will have the ornest support of every taxpayer. The light and water is your property and needs patronage to make it a success. Therefore you want to elect men whom you want to trust the matter and then help them all you can.
