Popular Instructor of University of Chicago Dismissed.

Chicago, Feb. 29.—Professor Oscar Lovell Triggs, professor of English literature at the University of Chicago, has been asked to leave the faculty at the end of the present school year. This announcement from the trustees came as a complete surprise to the university community as well as to Dr. Triggs himself. No reason has been assigned by the authorities, but it is believed that Professor Triggs' radical views on the social and economic problems of the day, which he has frequently expressed in public, have brought him into disfavor.

### BREWER ENDS HIS LIFE.

William J. Lemp, Despondent Over Loss of His Son, Shoots Himself. St. Louis, Mo., Feb. —William J. Lemp, president of the Lemp Brewing company, committed suicide at his residence, 6232 South Eighth street, by shooting himself in the right temple with a revolver. He died an hour later. Depression over the death of his favorite son, Fred Lemp, three years ago, and the loss of Frederick Pabst of Milwaukee, a lifelong friend, is believed to have been the cause for his rash act. Mr. Lemp, who was 63 years old and a native of Germany, lived in St. Louis for forty-eight years. He stood high in business and social circles and was reputed to be a millionaire.
