\$20,000 in Gold Bonds Lost.
New York, June 12.—Chubb & Sons, marine insurance brokers of this city, have reported to the postal authorities that 45 per cent gold bonds of the Guayaquil & Quito Railroad company, with an aggregate value of \$20,000, have been lost or stolen in transit from London. They were being shipped to a New York bank from its London branch, and according to cable advices, were posted on the steamer Kaiserin Augusta Victoria of the Hamburg-American line, which arrived in New York eight days ago.
