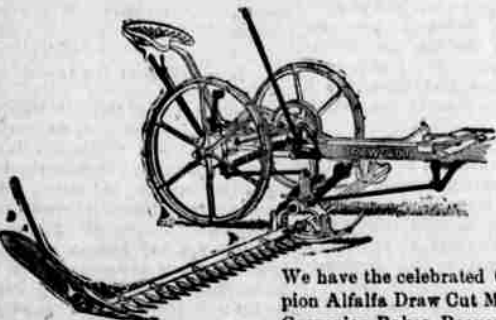

G. W. Taylor, on his trip to the coast, investigated several orchards along the route for Codling moth, and found it in nearly every instance, although he had been told that the pest was unknown in that region. Mr. Taylor found one circumstance in the Waldo section that was peculiar and in a manner confirms Mr. Taylor's theory that the moth does not travel to any great distance of itself, but spreads from orchard to orchard, unless the orchards join, by being carried either in one way or another. He found an old orchard near Waldo, planted there when the town was first started, and as long as the owner had lived there had been afflicted with moth, directly east of this place in the direction toward which the wind blows nearly invariably there, and about half a mile away was another orchard nearly as old, and entirely free from moth. The conditions would seem ideal for the moth to spread from one orchard to the other and the fact that they have not done so would indicate that they are not migratory to any great extent.
