While it is doubtless a necessity of the extremely practical age in which we live that the high office of president of the United States has come to be regarded simply as a position to be filled only by a man equipped both mentally and physically for hard work, we regret that it is so.

It is un-American, of course, that the presidency should be surrounded by any trappings or gewgaws of royalty, and no one desires anything like that, but there was a day when the occupant of the White House was looked upon as a man apart from other men and entitled to a respect that the dignity of his position called for.

General Washington, the first president, was a man of stately dignity. His birth and training were quite aristocratic. At the same time he was intensely democratic and no man was farther from the thought of permitting this country to drift into anything approaching a monarchy than he was.

Following General Washington, down the long line of presidents until these later times, the men who occupied the White House were invariably men who had a keen sense of the honor which the position they held bestowed upon their persons.

This was as it should be, for the reason that nothing could create a greater exaltation than that one man should be chosen by the free will of all his countrymen to preside over the destinies of a land. It is a dignity far exceeding that which comes to kings, who acquire the purple by the mere accident of birth.

It may be all for the best that the presidents of the future shall appear in the glare of publicity, plain and unadorned; but when this happens we have also lost something which was worth keeping. The American boy of the future who will be reared to look upon the presidency of the United States merely as a hard-worked man's job, instead of being reared, as his forefathers were, to look upon it as a gift from God such as He conferred upon David in the days of old, is in a manner robbed of

PETITION TO RECALL OLWELL

The voters of the First ward of this city are circulating a petition in order to invoke the recall law in order to elect a councilman in the place of John D. Olwell who is no longer a resident of that ward. The voters of the First feel that as they are entitled, under the charter, to have two representatives at the council board, that they should have them. In order to accomplish this a petition is being circulated asking for the recall of Mr. Olwell and for a special election to elect his successor.

It has been published that the prohibition forces of the city were the ones behind the movement. Such, however, is not the case, if the names upon the petition are any criterion. There are to be found names of voters who are known to be against prohibition. All party lines are seemingly cast aside by the First warders in order to have that ward have the representation at the council meetings that it is entitled to.

The petition is being very generally signed. Very few of those approached so far have refused to sign. The case is an interesting one owing to the fact that this is the first time the recall has been invoked in this part of Oregon.

POOR OLD HOBSON!

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., July 14.—Thomas J. O'Brien, American ambassador to Japan, arrived today from Tokyo. The ambassador was formerly United States minister to Copenhagen and is on a leave of absence to attend to business matters in Europe. In an interview with the Associated Press he said that any suspicion that might be harbored in this country in regard to Japan's sincerity in maintaining peace with the United States and its expression of amity and good will was without any cause or ground to justify it. He declared that in the year he had been in Japan he had never seen the slightest sign of ill feeling toward Americans, and

said it was absurd to think Japan wants war with this country. Referring to alleged discrimination against American shippers, he said it was probably true that the Japanese shippers were favored, but that discrimination was not because the shippers happened to be Americans, but that the Japanese were the biggest shippers.

FLEET AT HONOLULU.

HONOLULU, July 15.—Arrangements for receiving the Atlantic battleship fleet on arrival here tomorrow are now complete. The pilots and quarantine officials will board the fleet outside the harbor. No others will be allowed on board until after the fleet is anchored. Governor Freer will receive the official call of Rear Admiral Sperry tomorrow afternoon and will return it in a few hours. Officers of the fleet will be the governor's guests at dinner next Saturday.

Monday the fleet will be entertained by the chief justice of the Supreme court. Steamers are arriving here from other islands with hundreds of people to view the fleet.

Natural Conservators Meet.

C. B. Watson returned Saturday, from Portland, where he was called to attend a meeting of the Oregon State Commission for the conservation of Natural Resources, the members of which held a conference with Secretary of the Interior Garfield on his visit there Thursday. The work in hand is that which had its inception at the recent famous conference of the governors of the states held at the call of President Roosevelt at Washington. Although Gov. Chamberlain was not present at the national conference, having urgent political business at home about the date of the gathering, he was the first to accept the recommendation of President Roosevelt which followed the Washington conference, for the appointment of state commis-

WHITEWASH THE RACE.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 15.—The Rev. Zed D. Copp, probation officer of the Juvenile court, believes he has discovered a solution of the race problem. His theory is that a certain disease which afflicts negroes, turning their skin white, is caused by a bacillus, and he believes that by isolating the germ and inoculating colored persons with the serum he may be able to turn the entire race white.

"I have been studying this matter for some time and believe that the solution of the negro problem may lie concealed in this disease which turns the black man's skin white," Mr. Copp says. "I propose to continue my investigations, and will shortly ask the governmental aid in my plan."

"In one of the cases under observation the skin of the patient, not only on the face, but on the body as well, is gradually turning white. The skin remains healthy during the peculiar disorder. In one of the other cases the face only is affected. Still another case will need more investigation before I can speak intelligently on it. If we can prove that the whitening of negroes' skins in rare cases is caused by a bacillus, it would be possible to cultivate that bacillus and inoculate the negro race with it."
