SUNDAY THEATER MUST GO.
 GLYMPIA, Wash., July 18.—Final definite action was taken by the Supreme court today in the matter of the Sunday closing of theaters, when a motion was denied for a rehearing of the habeas corpus case of Frank H. Donnellan of Seattle. In the Herald case, from Tacoma, two months ago, the Supreme court sustained the validity of the law prohibiting theatrical entertainments on Sunday. Theater owners all over the state became interested at once and the discovery was made that the original law which was passed in territorial days had exempted anomalous counties from its provisions, which it was contended made the act a special law prohibited by the constitution. A test case was, therefore, made by the arrest of Donnellan, a Seattle theater manager, and the institution of habeas corpus proceedings on his behalf. The Supreme court held that the law, when copied into the code, omitted the Snohomish exception and on its adoption became a new and valid act. As a final move the theater people then asked a rehearing, which the Supreme court now denied.
