GUABANTEE BANKERS JUGGLED THE FUNDS

Plain evidence that the officials o the Title Guarantee & Trust company juggled the funds of the institution and then took the cash out of the gen eral deposits to cover a large shortage in the trust funds of the bank is shown by the statement of S. C. Spencer, who gathered his evidence from the books

of the bank. The hank closed its doors October 25 The receiver was appointed November 5. The day previous, November 5, the books of the bank showed that John P Shields, second trust officer of th bank, was charged with \$15,000 in eash \$5000 in drafts, a check for \$50,000 drawn by the Title Guarantee & Trust company in favor of Shields. Shields has now said that be deposited the \$5000 in drafts and the check for \$30. 000 in the bank of Ladd & Tilton in his own name. The \$15,000 in cash was afterwards turned over to Receiver Hill so Shields says, by check written by Shields.


