There are indications of a better feel ing in the castern apple trade now, is the following statement in the latest issue of the New York Fruitmen's

The situation, while it has shown the situation, while it has shown little if any improvement this week, is, all conditions considered, in a little better shape. A good many of the poor apples have been urged into consump ion at necessary sacrifices, and the narket has felt some relief. It must e admitted, however, that there is still a good deal of stock here and in sight, and while we look for a good demand from now up to the end of the year, it is my opinion that prices on ordinary upples will not show any marked improvement. A spell of very cold weather in the north would help he market a good deal, as it would tend to stop shipping to some extent. So far as our reports go, the up-river shipting sections are now getting cleaned up on ordinary apples, and though the shippers need money, they are not pressing sales so freely as was the case two weeks ago. In the general outlook the tast that the west is showing a little improvement must not be lost sight of, nd if signs count for anything we ar inkely to see a good deal better move ment out there than has been the case

in several weeks.

There has been a little improvemen n the money situation of late, and if this keeps up we are certain to see a better local demand. As it is now, dealers are keeping their actual wants only supplied, and there is no buying ahead. This means, of course, that there is a lessened consumption in somquarters. The prospects for the late winter are by no means defined, but if ast season can be taken as a fair criterion for this year, we should have at active late market, and higher once the erop is, all told, a full 20 per cent lighter than was the case las fact that the open weather up-state has illest of the evaporators to continue op erations longer, and a good many poples have been used up in this way the markets fresh, and caused lowe
