#### IMMUNITY FOR HARRIMAN SEPARATION OF BAILBOADS

Negotiations are under way between the attorney general and E. H. Harri-man looking to an agreement by which the Union Pacific will abandon all it direct control of the Southern Pacific in return for which the government wil agree not to prosecute Mr. Harriman for violation of the anti-trust law and of the competitive clauses in the interstate commerce law, states a dispatch The negotiations have not actually been concluded, but they have reached a stage where it is believed an agree ment will be entered into.

The Southern Pacific is to be organ ized as a separate corporation and the Union Pacific either will take over the to San Francisco or else will operate over it on a through line, as it is per mitted to do by law.

The holding company ofgenised by Mr. Harriman and his friends to take over the stock of the Santa Fe and Northern Pacific will probably continue, but the Union Pacific and its competing times will be stopped.
