**INSTALL LARGER MILL
ON BUZZARD MINE**

W. G. Y. Jones of England and C. W. Evans of Ashland, who hold a bond on the Buzzard group of mines on Elk creek, secured from the owners, Messrs. W. C. Leever and J. W. Merritt of this city and Peter Applegate of Jacksonville, were in town last Friday on their return from a trip to the mines. After making a thorough investigation of the property the gentlemen decided that inasmuch as the property is such a gigantic one in a low-grade proposition it will be necessary to install a larger mill plant at once, and they therefore entered into a new contract with the owners to install a 100-ton mill on the property within the next six months. Their expert, who is considered one of the best authorities on mining in the United States, has been summoned from New York and is now on his way here to make a thorough examination of the property and the best method of treating the ore. He is expected to arrive within a few days.

The development of this mine on a big scale means more to this section of southern Oregon than most people appreciate and, as Central Point is the nearest shipping point to the mine, this town will receive great benefit from the active development and continued working of the property.—Central Point Herald.

**PRICES CHARGED FOR WOOD
WILL BE LOWER SOON**

A much lower price of wood for next year is assured by the fact that plenty of men are now seeking work as wood choppers. Scarcity of labor was one of the causes of the unprecedented wood prices this year.

Last winter very few men could be secured to cut wood, the few who did work receiving at least \$4 per cord for cutting. Now men can be gotten for \$1 per cord, and several are cutting wood at that figure in the woods near Medford.

Rates for Dairyman.

For the benefit of those who may be interested in the promotion of the dairy industry in the state, the Southern Pacific company will issue tickets at a rate of one fare and one-third for the annual meeting of the Oregon Dairyman's association at Portland, December and 13, provided 50 or more attend from all parts of the state. Tickets may be purchased December 9 to 13, inclusive, and will be good for return passage including December 15.

**PRUNE MARKET EAST
IS DECIDEDLY WEAR**

Advisers from New York report a very dull dried fruit market, owing to financial conditions. Prunes were reported especially weak with many rejections of Oregon prunes owing to moldy condition on arrival and off-count. A considerable quantity of prunes remain unsold in this state and at present the prospect of disposing of them at good prices is not bright. This has been a season when the early sellers can see granulate themselves.
