

PACIFIC & EASTERN CLAIMS AGAINST BANK CANCELLED

**Estacada State Bank Saved From Being
Forced Into Insolvency by Court's
Order Returning Certificates of De-
posit in Oregon Savings Bank.**

To save the Estacada State bank from being forced into insolvency, Judge Gantenbein of the circuit court at Portland has issued an order directing Thomas C. Devito, as receiver of the Oregon Trust & Savings bank, to deliver to the Estacada bank two certificates of deposit aggregating \$41,256, on condition that the Pacific & Eastern Railway company will cancel the claim it holds against the Oregon Trust & Savings bank for its deposit of \$40,423.31, and will make a cash payment of \$827.69 to the Portland bank.

Got No Consideration.

According to the statement of the Estacada State bank, in the petition of Louis J. White against the Oregon Trust & Savings bank the two certificates of deposit to the Oregon Trust & Savings bank for \$20,025 each, were issued May 29, 1907, by the Estacada institution upon the request of the Pacific & Eastern Railway company and of the defunct Portland bank. No return consideration whatever was given the Estacada bank, the understanding among the three parties being that the certificates were to be paid by the railway company. At the time of the failure of the Oregon Trust & Savings bank they were still outstanding.

Bank Relieved of Debt.

The Pacific & Eastern Railway com-

pany was organized to construct a railroad from Jew Har, Jackson county, to a point near Crater lake. It had on deposit with the Oregon Trust bank at the time of the bank's failure \$40,423.31. If the Estacada bank had been compelled to meet the certificates, which could legally have been done, it would have been forced into insolvency, according to the petitioners, so that the institution would not only have been unable to pay in full for the certificates, but could not have paid its depositors. The petition shows that the railway company is willing to fulfill its part of the agreement by turning over its deposit in the defunct Portland bank and making a cash payment to balance the amount of the claim held against the Estacada bank.

By complying with Judge Gantenbein's order, Receiver Devito will be relieved of a debt of more than \$40,000 owed the railway company, and the Estacada bank will be enabled to continue in business.

**MUCH TAN BARK
USED IN OREGON**

In 1906 Oregon used 17,000 cords of oak tan bark, valued at \$437,000, or \$25.73 a cord. It used 1290 cords of hemlock bark, valued at \$12,900, or \$10.50 a cord. The total was 18,290 cords, valued at \$450,000, or \$24.60 a cord. California used nearly twice as much, the per cord value being \$20.48.

Tan bark brought the lowest price in New Hampshire, and the highest in Oregon, with an average of \$9.30 per cord. More than in bark the price of extract varied widely according to the material from which it was manufactured. The extract of quibralco, a tree of Mexico, Central America, South America and the West Indies, from which seven-eighths of all imported tanning materials are secured, had an average price of \$18 per barrel; and benzoin brought \$12.60 per barrel; oak \$2.90 per barrel and chestnut \$9.12 per barrel.
