ORDINANCE NO. 139.
 An ordinance licensing and regulating certain classes of trade, business and occupation, and vocations in the city of Medford, Oregon.
 The people of the city of Medford do ordain as follows:
 Section 1. It shall be unlawful within the city of Medford, Oregon, after the 24 day of January, 1908, for any person, firm, company or corporation, to do, perform, conduct or carry on any of the trades, businesses, occupations or professions or vocations hereinafter mentioned without having first paid to the city recorder of said city for license so to do, the amount of license set opposite the respective name and description of such trade, business, occupation, profession or vocation in the schedule following, to-wit:
 Covering circus, one exhibition per day\$15.00
 Two-ring circus, one exhibition per day 50.00
 Three-ring circus, one exhibition per day 50.00
 One-ring circus and menagerie, one exhibition per day 15.00
 Two-ring circus and menagerie, one exhibition per day 50.00
 Three-ring circus and menagerie, one exhibition per day 50.00
 One-ring circus, two exhibitions per day 25.00
 Two-ring circus, two exhibitions per day 75.00
 Three-ring circus, two exhibitions per day 75.00
 One-ring circus and menagerie, two exhibitions per day 25.00
 Two-ring circus and menagerie, two exhibitions per day 75.00
 Three-ring circus and menagerie, two exhibitions per day 75.00
 All other shows under canvas, according to size, at the discretion of the city recorder, per day, from\$10.00 to 25.00
 Companies or troupes advertising or selling patent medicines or proprietary remedies or other merchandise, each exhibition... 10.00
 Street hawkers or vendors, per day 10.00
 Foot peddlers, per day, each... 3.00
 Peddlers, with wagon, per day, each 5.00
 Draymen, with one horse, each, per quarter 3.00
 Draymen, with two horses, each, per quarter 5.00
 Express or delivery wagons, one horse, each, per quarter 1.50
 Express or delivery wagons, two horses, each, per quarter 2.00
 Billiard, pool or pigeon-hole tables, each table, per quarter... 5.00
 Bowling alleys, each, per quarter 5.00
 Auctioneers, per quarter 10.00
 Pawnbrokers, per quarter 2.00
 Shating rinks, per quarter... 5.00
 Bill, sign and advertisement posters, per quarter 5.00
 Shooting galleries, per quarter... 10.00
 Fortune tellers, each, per day... 5.00
 Lunch wagons, for each variety of food or drink served, per month 5.00
 Section 2. Any person, firm, company or corporation, or the agent thereof, upon the tender of the license herein provided, may, in the discretion of the city recorder or the city council, be licensed to do, conduct, perform or carry on such trade, business, occupation or profession within said city, subject to all of the laws, ordinances and police regulations thereof, provided, that all exhibitors and performers of a dancing show, or any other kind of a dancing show, shall have a license from the city recorder of Medford or vicinity, may, in the discretion of the city council, be permitted to be given in said city without payment of any license therefor.
 Section 3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent residents of Medford from fittingly advertising their own business or wares, without the payment of any license fees; provided, that no person or persons, firm or corporation shall be permitted to write, print, or otherwise insert any sign or advertising matter upon any sidewalk or upon any other public place in the said city.
 Section 4. No shooting gallery shall be permitted to operate in any place after the hour of 10 o'clock P. M.

 TEHERAN, Dec. 29.—Another change in the situation at the Persian capital has been brought about by the intervention of priests, who with the promise that a satisfactory solution of the crisis will be found have induced opposing factions to disperse.
ENTIRE PRUNE CROP NOW OUT OF THE WAY
 "The Southern Pacific has shipped 21,000,000 pounds of prunes out of Oregon this autumn," state Traveling Freight Agent Malboen, who spent a few days in Medford this week. "Before December 1 the entire crop was out of the way. We handled six million pounds in six weeks, or 81 carloads. Through prompt service growers received payment for every car before the financial stringency ruined the eastern market. By our service, many thousands of dollars was saved growers."

on a week day, nor at any hour on Sunday, and in the event that any shooting gallery be kept open after said hour, or upon a Sunday, the license of such shooting gallery may be forthwith revoked by the city council, without notice to the proprietor or persons in charge of such shooting gallery.
 Section 6. For the purposes of this ordinance, draymen are defined to be persons who keep any dray, wagon, cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of freight, merchandise or other goods in quantity, from place to place in said city for hire; and express or delivery wagons are defined to be wagons or vehicles used for the delivery of goods, wares and merchandise sold by merchants or others in said city, for hire, or for the conveyance for hire of parcels, packages, trunks or baggage, within said city.
 Section 7. No fees or charges other than those hereby provided shall be imposed upon any of the trades, businesses, occupations or vocations herein enumerated.
 Section 8. Any person or persons, firm or corporation, or any agent of such person, firm or corporation, or any employee thereof, who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction of such violation before the city recorder be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and shall pay the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such fine and such costs shall be committed to and confined in the city jail of said city one day for each \$2.00 of such fine and costs remaining unpaid. And every repetition of such violation shall constitute a separate offense under this section.
 Section 9. Ordinances numbered 122 and 152 of the original series of ordinances, and 29, 29, 31, 32, 33, 34 and 35 of the present series, and all other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. The foregoing ordinance was passed by the city council on the 17th day of December, 1907, Osoolungwa voting yes, Trowbridge yes, Elbert yes, Harbald yes, Ottwell yes, Hester yes.
