#### SHIPPING SALMON EGGS TO WEDDERBURN HATCHERY

Two million salmon eggs are being shipped from the Elk creek hatchery on the Upper Rogue river to R. D. Hume's Indian creek hatchery at Wedderburn at the mouth of the Rogue, via Portland and Coos Bay.

If this extremely difficult and tedious task of transportation shall be successfully performed there will have been placed in this hatchery this year a total of 2,040,000 eggs, which is considerably more than were secured last year. The mortality will be greatly reduced from what it was during that period for the reason that the question of food for the tiny fish has been successfully solved. During the past fishing season the heads and melt have been ground, canned and cooked, so that the necessity of feeding beef, which food caused considerable mortality last year, will be avoided. It is expected that fully 2,000,000 healthy little chinooks measuring from 3½ to 5 inches in length will come from Indian creek rearing ponds in the early spring and be planted at the mouth of the Rogue river.

#### Buy Tickets by Wire.

Something which is of considerable interest to the public generally and which is perhaps not generally known is the system of prepaid orders now in effect between stations of the Southern Pacific company and all points in the United States. By means of this system tickets may be purchased at Medford from any place in the United States and mailed or telegraphed direct to the party wishing to come here. Sleepers, accommodations and small amounts of cash in connection with these tickets may also be furnished at the same time.

#### SALE OF MUNICIPAL BONDS

Some proposals will be received by the city council of the city of Medford, Oregon at the office of the city recorder of said city, until Friday, January 10, 1908, at 6 o'clock p.m., for the purpose of \$25,000 in ten-year 5 per cent coupon bonds of said city, in denominations of \$500 each, interest payable semi-annually. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check for an amount equal to 5 per cent of the amount of such bid, payable to the city of Medford, and said city council reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
