PORTUGUESE PLOTTER ESCAPES FROM JAIL

LONDON, Jan. 24.—A dispatch from Lisbon states that Dr. Fernando Lopez, accompanied with the recent conspiracy to blow up the premier of France with a bomb, made a sensational and daring escape from St. Julian prison at the mouth of the Tagus river today. The entire staff of the fortress, including the commander, has been arrested under suspicion of accepting a bribe to permit his escape.
