D. 1918, together with interest on said sum from the date hereof until paid, at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of February and August in each year, upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons hereto attached as they severally become due.

This bond is one of a series of like tenor and is issued for paying street intersections and completing City Hall pursuant to and in full compliance with the charter of said city and under and in accordance with an ordinance of said city, duly passed. And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuing of this bond necessary to make the same legal and valid have been properly done, happened and been performed in regular and due form and time as required by law, and that the total indebtedness of said City of Medford, including this bond, does not exceed the constitutional and statutory limitations.
