ORDINANCE NO. 144.

An ordinance authorizing the issue of the bonds of the City of Medford, Oregon, to the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. That for the purpose of paying street intersections and completing City Hall there are hereby authorized to be issued the bonds of the City of Medford to the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars, which said bonds shall be dated the first day of February, 1908, and be in the denomination of one thousand dollars, and shall be known as "General Improvement Bonds," and shall be numbered from one to twenty-five, both inclusive.

Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder. Said bonds shall become due ten years after date and shall bear interest, evidenced by coupons at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, and both principal and interest of said bonds shall be made payable at the office of the City Treasurer of Medford, Oregon, or at the banking house of Kuntze Bros. in the City of New York, State of New York.

Section 2. The bonds hereby authorized shall be in substantially the following form:

United States of America, No.— State of Oregon, \$1,000, City of Medford, General Improvement Bond. Know All Men by These Presents, That the City of Medford, in the County of Jackson and State of Oregon, acknowledges to owe, and for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer the sum of one thousand dollars lawful money of the United States of America on the first day of February, A. D. 1918, together with interest on said sum from the date hereof until paid, at the rate of six per centum per
